Submission Procedures: Please submit the full paper in electronic form as a PDF file to the site <http://www.eit-conference.info/papers/> and with a copy as an attachment via email to the *eit2005 program co-chair* and the *eit2005 General Chair* (hsharif@unomaha.edu and hvakilzadian@unl.edu). Paper submissions should be complete manuscripts, not exceeding six pages (inclusive of figures, tables, and bibliography) in a standard IEEE two-column format. The format information, which also includes download format sheets for PDF, can be obtained from: <http://www.computer.org/cspress/instruct.htm>. The title page should include the name of author(s), their affiliations and e-mail addresses. All the submitted papers will be reviewed by the International Program Committee (IPC), and they will be judged with respect to their quality, originality, and relevance. All the accepted papers will be published in the conference proceedings after the advance registration of at least one of the authors. The expanded version of a selected group of papers, judged by the IPC for their quality, will be considered for publication in the special issue of a research journal, after a final review. In addition all the accepted papers will be published and archived in the IEEE-Explore Database.
