Norman Sammons Jr., a doctoral student in chemical engineering at Auburn University, is the recipient of an Environmental Protection Agency Science to Achieve Results (STAR) Fellowship.

Sammons is currently pursuing a master's degree in business administration along with his doctorate in chemical engineering. He received his bachelor's degree in chemical engineering from Georgia Tech.

His individual fellowship will award approximately \$111,000 over three years to perform research under the direction of Mario Eden in the chemical engineering department.

Sammons is developing a decision-making framework that enables identification of the products and processing routes corresponding to optimum economical and environmental performance for integrated biorefineries.

Two juveniles, including a current Beulah High School student, face up to 15 counts of criminal eavesdropping related to video tapes found last week that allegedly show girls dressing inside the school girls locker room.

Thursday reported that the two juvenile defendants identified in the case are a female, age 15 at the time of the incident and currently a BHS student, and a male who was 17 at the time and not a student at BHS.
